OBJECTIVES BELSPO POST-COVID PROJECT - I

- Belspo call post-covid
 - “Stay at home” signified a supplementary stake for people experiencing homelessness
 - New forms of collaboration with health, diagnostical and quarantine services were created in urgent ways
 - Pandemic also showed new forms of non-take-up (of crisis measures and others), an ongoing invisibilization of women and amplified the digital divide
 - Pandemic and different health- and welfare policy measures
 - Few knowledge is identified about the workforce of social workers, educators and others in contact with homeless people during the covid-19 pandemic
 - Homeless sector the majority of services (especially shelters) were considered as essential and remained (partially) open
- => implement new procedures and organisation

OBJECTIVES BELSPO POST-COVID PROJECT - II

- Homelessness at the intersection of various social inequalities of **poverty** ('class'), **migration** ('race and ethnicity'), and **place/space** ('rural and urban circumstances'), resulting in old and new manifestations of homeless people's **denizenship** (Turner, 2016).
 - Transdisciplinary research and homelessness as a "wicked problem" (De Corte et al, 2017)
 - Regional and federal governments insisted on integrated approaches of homelessness before the pandemic
 - Question how the pandemic affected these approaches?
 - What could be learned in order to better understand (non-)take-up of rights?
 - How did the workforce as well as the people experiencing homelessness adapt to changing situations?
- => How could we prepare awareness and raising capabilities of multi-level governance actors regarding future crises?**

APPROACH

Investigate local welfare assemblies

- Broad approach comparing 15 cities
- Policy documents and expert interviews

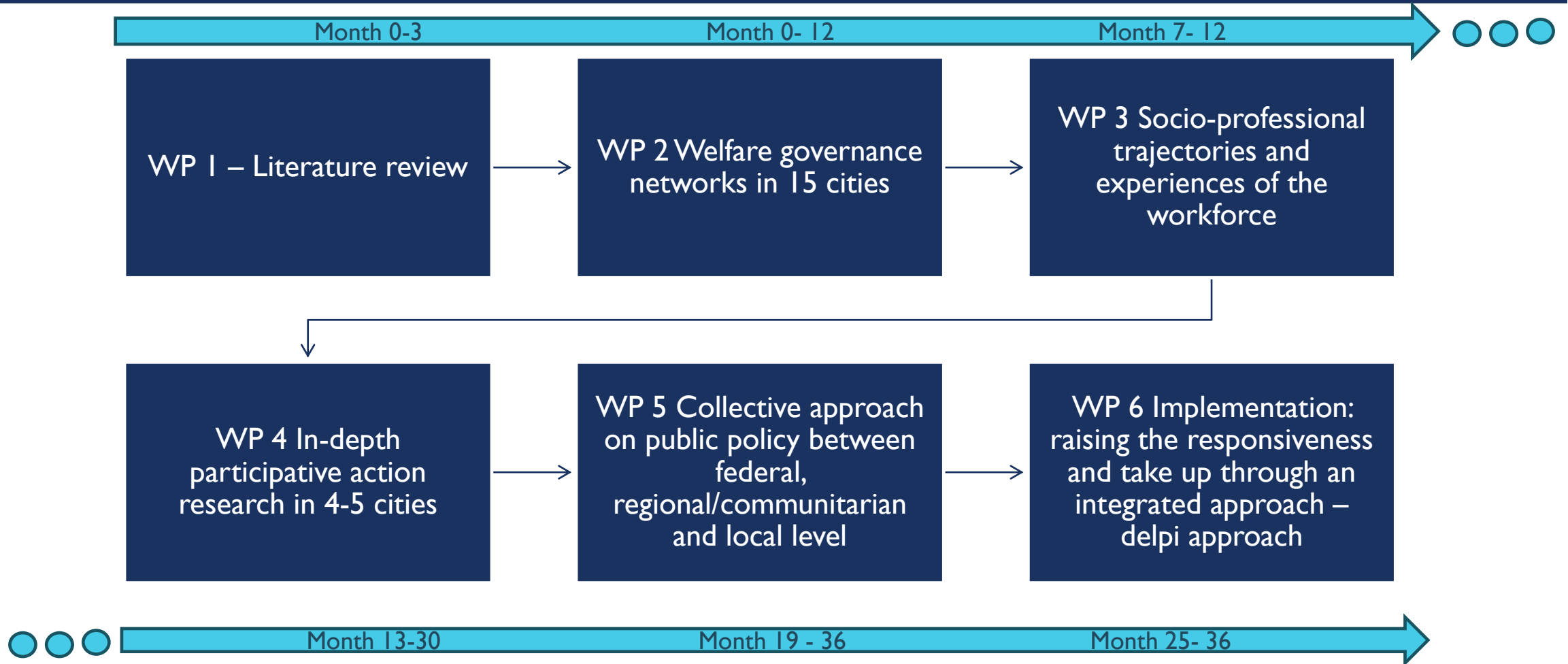
Participatory Action Research


- Fine tuning research and preparing implementation in 4-5 cities
- With local actors (inadequately housed people, social workers and responsible persons for the implementation for public policy)

Co-construction and implementing

- Action plans based on policy orientations
- Create future responsiveness and actual take up of social rights
